He was then removed to Oxford, where, in September 1767, he was entered a gentleman-commoner of University college, Sir Robert Chambers being his tutor. While at Oxford, he took so little interest in public affairs, that, it was the standing joke of one of his contemporaries, that Windham would never know who was prime minister. This disinclination to a political life, added to a modest diffidence in his own talents, led him, at the period which is now spoken of, to reject an offer which, by a youth not more than twenty years of age, might have been considered as a splendid one; - that of being named secretary to his father's friend, Lord Townshend, who had been appointed Lord Lieutenant of Ireland. After four years residence, he left Oxford in 1771. He always retained feelings...
