Nearly 62 per cent of the cases were native-born individuals and families, nearly 75 per cent of the men afforded relief were married at the time, and over 50 per cent included families where there were three or more children. According to the reports of the New York Board of Charities for 1910 nearly one-third of the 328,000 persons receiving relief had been rendered destitute because of sickness. Of 5,000 destitute families coming under the observation of the Charity Organization Society in New York City, three-fourths were found to be destitute wholly or partly on account of sickness. (E. T. Devine: Misery and Its Causes, p. 204.) Thus a vicious circle of economic disadvantages due to sickness and conditions causing sickness is established. Overwork and worry, insanitary housing and community surroundings, and lack of nutritious food are frequent causes...
